

Vintage 2025: An early harvest for a promising vintage

Once again, Loire wines reflect the commitment, agility and passion of those who make them. Marked by high temperatures that brought forward the start of the harvest, with the first Chardonnays harvested shortly after 15th August for the sparklings, the 2025 vintage presents moderate volumes overall but very good organoleptic quality. The 2025 vintage is very promising, heralding harmonious wines that are both elegant and very expressive.



IN NANTES VINEYARDS: EXCEPTIONAL QUALITY, BETWEEN FULL MATURITY AND TENSION

In the Nantes vineyards, the harvest, which began on 22nd August for the first Muscadets (Melon Blanc grape variety), was marked not only by its early start but also by the remarkable health of the grapes. The 2025 vintage offers a superb balance between full maturity and freshness: the promise of great wines for ageing.

IN ANJOU-SAUMUR VINEYARDS: GREAT POTENTIAL AHEAD

In the Anjou-Saumur region, harvests broke records, starting on 18th August and continuing under particularly favourable conditions. Sparklings, dry and off-dry rosés, reds, dry and sweet whites: the entire production of PDO wines shows very satisfactory ripeness. The 2025 vintage will undoubtedly be among the highest quality.



IN TOURAINE VINEYARDS: A YEAR MARKED BY EARLY MATURITY AND BALANCE

The serene conditions in which the harvest took place favoured the production of high-quality fruits. Bright and promising, the 2025 vintage in Touraine is characterised by wines that are precise, elegant and expressive.



While the white grape harvest began exceptionally early, the red grape varieties stand out for their high quality potential, promising wines that are both structured and expressive.



The 2025 vintage is the result of a year's work during which flexibility and responsiveness were required.

On each plot, for each grape variety, the Loire winegrowers were able to reconcile the demands of Mother Nature. After two intense heatwaves, followed by rainfall at the end of July, the grapes ripened rapidly in early August. The harvest therefore began very early this year, but the first juices proved particularly promising. The 2025 vintage fully embodies the identity of our wine-growing region: freshness and elegance, expressed through a rich organoleptic palette."

In France's third-largest wine-growing region for wines with a protected designation of origin, the Loire Wine Council, InterLoire brings together 3,000 winegrowers, merchants and co-operatives, representing 80% of the volume of wine produced in the region. Loire Wines brings together 34 Protected Designation of Origin (PDO) from the Nantes, Anjou-Saumur, Touraine, Vallée du Loir and Haut-Poitou vineyards, as well as the Val de Loire and Protected Geographical Indication (PGI), covering 42,000 hectares and 14 départements from Vendée to Puy-de-Dôme. Its purpose is to represent, promote and enhance Loire wines, by serving the collective of Loire producers and guiding and coordinating the vineyard's response to the challenges of the future, in a sustainable and equitable way. Its missions are the economic management of the sector, research and experimentation, the collective promotion of Loire Wines, and the coordination of the key players in the Loire wine industry.
